#### **New Matrix Isolation Lab**

The Department of Chemistry developed a laboratory (The Matrix



Isolation Infrared Spectors Facility) last semester using funds received from DST. The laboratory introduces the facility of low temperature optical measurements of isolated molecules and

clusters. In matrix isolation, target molecules are trapped in an inert gas matrix at low temperatures. This results in sharp spectral features and no intermolecular interactions.




